Become a Martin Scholar!

The Felix E. Martin, Jr. Foundation wants to help make your plans for achieving your associate degree a reality. The Foundation and Madisonville Community College have joined together to create the Martin Scholars Program, designed to help adults who have made a good start on their associate degree, but for whatever reason, haven't had the chance to finish.

Who is eligible for Martin Scholars?

Full-time residents of Muhlenberg County age 25 and older who:

- have not earned a college degree and
- have successfully completed at least 30 credit hours of college-level coursework from any regionally accredited college or university.

How does the Martin Scholars Program help me?

Students accepted in the program who enroll full-time will receive a **\$500 cash stipend** each semester they make satisfactory progress toward a degree at MCC. Part-time students will receive a **\$250 cash stipend** each semester they make satisfactory academic progress. Students may use the funds to offset any costs you may encounter while finishing your degree: books, supplies, transportation, child care, etc. **In addition, each Martin Scholar will receive a \$400 bonus when they complete a workforce readiness seminar and their degree at MCC!**
